STATEMENT OF FACTS

Locations of Violations:

- 1. Place of registration of Anne Grassie in 2012 prior to her June 7, 2012 declaration of state representative candidacy.
- 2. Polling location for Ward 6 in Rochester, NH (Elks Lodge #1393, 41 Columbus, Avenue, Rochester).

Dates of Violations:

- 1. Date of registration of Anne Grassie in Ward 6, Rochester in 2012 (exact date unknown);
- 2. January 10, 2012 (date of New Hampshire Presidential Primary); and
- 3. September 11, 2012 (date of New Hampshire State Primary).

Basis for Complaint:

Anne Grassie lives at 9 Central Avenue #11 in Rochester, New Hampshire. Her residence was 9 Central Avenue #11 in Rochester, New Hampshire in November 2010 when she was elected as a member of the 2011-2012 New Hampshire House of Representatives.¹

It is clear that 9 Central Avenue is Rep. Grassie's long-standing domicile.² She identified 9 Central Avenue as her residence, as examples, when she was elected to the 1995-1996 session of the Legislature,³ the 1997-1998 session of the Legislature,⁴ the 1999-2000 session of the Legislature,⁵ the 2003-2004

session of the Legislature,⁶ the 2005-2006 session of the Legislature,⁷ and the 2009-2010 session of the Legislature.⁸ She voted out of 9 Central Avenue in the November 8, 2011 municipal election.⁹

Not only has Anne Grassie repeatedly identified 9 Central Avenue as her exclusive residence over the last 15 years when she has run for, and been elected as, a state representative, but also she had admitted that 9 Central Avenue remained her residence at least through September 20, 2012, the date of her testimony before the Ballot Law Commission.¹⁰

On September 21, 2012, the continuance of Rep. Grassie's residence at 9 Central Avenue, Rochester during the period of her election to the 2011-2012 General Court and through the date of her testimony on September 20, 2012 was confirmed in an order of the Ballot Law Commission, where it was stated, in describing the testimony of Rep. Grassie, that:

She testified that her intent is to live at 146 Brock Street, but that due to the ongoing renovations, she has been spending time at the Central Avenue house.¹¹

As outlined above, Rep. Grassie not only has never claimed that 146 Brock Street is her residence, but she made two significant admissions in her post-2012 state primary testimony before the Ballot Commission with regard to her residence. First, she admitted that she was "spending time at the Central Avenue house," thereby conceding to the allegations before the Ballot Commission that 9 Central Avenue was where she was living. More significantly, however, Rep. Grassie not only conceded in her testimony that she did not live at 146 Brock Street, but also she admitted that, as of the date of that post-

September 11, 2012 primary testimony, she had nothing greater than an "intent" to reside at 146 Brock Street.

Rep. Grassie's claimed residence at 9 Central Avenue is located in Rochester Ward 6.¹² The address where she intends to move at some point, 146 Brock Street, is located in Rochester Ward 4.¹³

Up until the 2012 election cycle, Rochester was a city that elected its state representatives at large, meaning that it did not matter in which of the six Rochester wards a candidate resided in order to seek election to the New Hampshire House. Prior to this year, for example, a state representative candidate could live at 9 Central Avenue in Rochester or 146 Brock Street, Rochester and, for the purpose of her state representative candidacy in Rochester, it made no difference.

Because of legislative redistricting in 2012, for the 2012 election cycle, including the September 11, 2012 state primary, it did very much matter in which ward a Rochester state representative candidate is domiciled. A Rochester state representative candidate can be elected only out of the ward in which she is domiciled. For example, a candidate living in Rochester Ward 4, but wishing to avoid a Ward 4 primary contest, could not just file to run in Ward 6, where there was no primary. That candidate needed to be domiciled in Ward 6 – including moving to Ward 6 – in order to be an elected representative from Ward 6.

In the 2012 state primary, Rep. Grassie was the only state representative candidate from her party from Ward 4, the ward where she did not live. There was another Democrat state representative candidate in Ward 6, the ward where she does live.

Despite Rep. Grassie's uninterrupted residence at 9 Central Avenue, at some point prior to June 7, 2012, she changed her voter registration to 146 Brock Street in Rochester in order to appear as a registered voter in Ward 4. Thereafter, and on June 7, she signed a notarized declaration of state representative candidacy for the 2012-2014 legislative term in which she swore that she was domiciled in Ward 4 at 146 Brock Street in Ward 4.¹⁴

Rep. Grassie's statements in her candidacy declaration and the accompany affidavit were in direct contradiction to her statements later in September 2012, when she testified before the Ballot Law Commission that she

only intended to move to 146 Brock Street and continued to "spend time" in Ward 6 at 9 Central Avenue.

On September 11, 2012, Rep. Grassie voted in a ward in Rochester in which she did not live. She voted in Ward 4 based on a claim that she resided at 146 Brock Street, Rochester, even though 9 Central Avenue, Rochester, which is in Rochester Ward 6, was and remained her residential address. Less than 10 days later she stood before the Ballot Law Commission and admitted that she only had an intent to move to Ward 4 and reside at 146 Brock Street.

The foregoing facts signify that all and each of the following violations of New Hampshire election laws by Rep. Anne Grassie occurred:

- 1. In 2012, Rep. Anne Grassie registered to vote in a City of Rochester ward where she was not domiciled and falsely stated her domicile address when she did register, in violation of RSA 659:34. 16
- 2. On June 7, 2012, Rep. Anne Grassie falsely declared under RSA 655:17¹⁷ that she was domiciled in Rochester Ward 4 (Strafford County District 11) when in fact on that date she was a domiciliary of Rochester Ward 6 and could only declare her candidacy in Rochester Ward 6.¹⁸
- 3. On September 11, 2012, in violation of RSA 659:34, Rep. Anne Grassie voted in Ward 4, Rochester claiming herself then to be a domiciliary of Rochester Ward 4 even though she was in fact and under RSA 659:34 domiciled in Rochester Ward 6.







RESIDENCY CHALLENGE OF ANNE C. GRASSIE – DEMOCRATIC CANDIDAET FOR STATE REPRESENTATIVE FROM STRAFFORD DISTRICT NO. 11

ORDER

On September 20, 2012, the Ballot Law Commission ("the Commission") held a public hearing, pursuant to RSA 665:7 to hear and determine disputes arising over whether nomination papers or declarations of candidacy filed with the Secretary of State conform with the law. Specifically, the complainant, Rochester Representative Clifford A. Newton, challenged whether Rochester Representative Anne Grassie is currently residing in Rochester District No. 11, Ward 4.

The Commission heard testimony from Representative Newton and others that Representative Grassie's car is often seen parked at her other residence in Ward 6, at 9 Central Avenue, raising a suspicion in their minds as to her real domicile.

The Commission also heard from Representative Grassie who testified that she and her husband own two houses in Rochester, including her current residence in Ward 4, at 146 Brock Street, that they are in the process of renovating 146 Brock Street, that she has registered to vote in Ward 4, changed her driver's license accordingly, and uses that address in the General Court website. She testified that her intent is to live at 146 Brock Street, but that due to the on-going renovations, she has been spending time at the Central

Avenue house. She further testified that her husband has owned 146 Brock Street for 20 years.

The Commission considered the provisions of RSA 655:8 and voted, unanimously, to deny the petition challenging Representative Grassie's residency, finding that her intent as to her domicile, when considered along with the facts presented, is determinative and establishes her residence as in the ward from which she is seeking office.
